## **Biodiversity Project underway**

Borthwick Park will benefit from a new collaboration between the KRA and Council. The General Manager of Urban Services, Mr Peter Perilli has given Council's approval, in principle, for 350 initial native plantings, pending further project scoping, obtaining insurance and the finalising of a management plan.

John Legg of the KRA says "This great community initiative is an opportunity to work with Council to bring small birds and native fauna back to Borthwick Park".

It is hoped that, if successful, this will be the start of a wider cross-Kensington biodiversity initiative.

Changes to State Government legislation mean that the KRA no longer receives notification of Category 2 development plans. Council was not able to consider our submission on the development of the old Spinelli factory site – a plan that included demolition of an historic bluestone house.

If you receive notification that a block of flats or large, inappropriate extension is to be made over your side fence, contact the KRA. We are happy to offer you our expertise to help challenge inappropriate development in our suburb.
