KENSINGTON – THE PLACE TO BE.....?

Many local residents may have noted the recent article in the Advertiser which listed Kensington as one of the top 5 suburbs in South Australia for the last two years running. Of course this article wasn't discussing the importance of lifestyle, community and amenity, but focussed on the best places to 'invest' One could argue however that all these issues are intrinsically connected in the case of Kensington.

Most would agree that this suburb is one which presents a 'unique' lifestyle. Kensington is tagged as a 'Village' and its layout is physically at odds with the surrounding suburbs. For a small suburb there are more than 11 buildings listed on the state heritage register and its history is evident at almost every corner. These are just some of the factors which give Kensington its strong sense of identity within the city of Adelaide.

But this identity extends beyond its physical attributes. It is the people of Kensington that give this place its vitality and character. Without contributions from the community Kensington would not look and feel the way it does. My wife and I moved here just over 11 years ago and we still learn new things, meet new people and experience new events on a regular basis right here in this Village of ours. Just scanning over the number of events listed in this newsletter alone, I am constantly surprised by the amount of activity this community is able to generate. I often communicate stories of community planting bees, BBQ's, lunches and musical events all organised, run and executed by community volunteers. Friends return confused looks, raised eyebrows and statements like 'I wish that happened here'.

Obviously Kensington's proximity to the CBD and its close relationship to the Parade contribute to its property values, and makes it and an attractive place to invest. But it's the character of its community which makes it a place people want to live.

How to participate?

- 1. Register if you would like your gate to be included on the site map (popup/ guerrilla gates welcome)
- 2. Create your gate throughout October, the earlier the better

Reduce, reuse and recycle

To avoid creating waste, use items that would be easily recyclable via the Council kerbside collections (such as: cardboard and paper product that have become water or weather damaged could be 'recycled' via the green lidded organics wheelie bin, cartons - milk, juice and other cartons, glass jars and bottles, steel lids, aerosol cans - for your paint, steel and aluminium cans, paint tins if empty and dry, hard plastic containers including pot plant containers - as long as they are clean).

Ideas for decorating your gate

Have a conversation with your family, friends or neighbours about: What makes Kensington a great place?, to inspire you. KENSINGTON DAY OF GARAGE SALES 2012

Kensington Neighbours Unite for a Suburb-Wide Garage Sale!

How often are buyers able to find over 20 garage sales in one suburb? Kensington residents can have access to hundreds of garage sale customers from throughout the metro area, on the morning of Saturday 25th August. As a selling participant, all you have to do is register before 17th August and the Kensington Residents' Association will do the rest – advertising in press, on the main roads and signage for your property. As a customer, just show up and enjoy the day! From 8.00 am, interested purchasers collect maps from Pioneer Park in Maesbury Street, Kensington or download the information from our website. The map pinpoints all the participating houses and lists any particular goods of interest.

What about unsold items? Unsold items may be left for Council's hard rubbish collection the following week. Brilliant.

Swap your unwanted goods If you don't have enough items to sell at the sale, simply bring along any unwanted goods (of good quality) and 'swap' them for something else. The swap table will be in Pioneer Park during the morning and all leftover goods will be donated to charity. Alternatively, you could team up with neighbours and hold a combined garage sale or you may donate unwanted items to Norwood Girl Guides who will set up their stall in Pioneer Park.

Join us for a happy hour! Get to know your fellow neighbours by coming to our Happy Hour at the Kensington Hotel from 4pm – an assortment of drinks will be available to participants at reduced prices.
