Previous garage sale events have been very popular and a great way to meet some locals, clear out the shed and make a couple of dollars at the same time.



BORTHWICK AND PIONEER PARK BIODIVERSITY PROJECTS



Over the last couple of months our wonderful volunteers have been very busy in both our parks undertaking our major plantings for 2015.

Two working bees have been held in Borthwick Park to plant about 400 new plants and do some much needed weeding. In Pioneer Park about 150 new plants were established in one session. Volunteers have contributed over 130 hours over the last couple of months.

The next working bee in Borthwick Park is on Sunday 13th September. Come and join fellow residents as we work together to increase biodiversity in Kensington. Morning tea provided - note the date in your diary.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

In our last newsletter we alluded to the government's intention to get rid of Historic Conservation Zones and Contributory Items as part of proposed new planning legislation. The latest indications are that legislation will be introduced to Parliament in late September. It is anticipated that there will be a public consultation period of four to six weeks commencing late October.

There will be a Community Participation Charter but it is expected that community participation will effectively be limited to involvement in the development of policies, strategies and development plans with no improvement in the level of public consultation on individual development applications.

Development Assessment Panels will not have any elected representatives and regionalisation will likely come in future.

The Community Alliance is organising a forum "South Australia is our backyard: community views on the new planning system" to be held at 7pm on Wednesday 21st October. The forum will be held in the Burnside Ballroom. Anyone with concerns about the destruction of our heritage or being excluded from being notified or being able to comment on development applications that will affect their neighbourhood is encouraged to attend. Details will be provided on the KRA website when available.

At this stage, nothing further has been heard about the proposed rezoning of Kensington's Mixed Use Historic Conservation Zone along The Parade
