#### **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

When I sat down to write this note I was reflecting on how lucky we (all of us) are to live in our beautiful suburb. Leafy streets, populated with some wonderful examples of early design and building techniques, are a part of the appeal, but the community spirit of our neighbours is also a big part of the picture.

Our own home in High Street was listed as a Contributory Item in the Historic Conservation Zone and this meant that it was saved from demolition back in 2004. It's worth noting that the Kensington Residents Association was instrumental in, not only lobbying for the street trees out the front, but in compiling the list of heritage properties. Without this KRA input, numbers 41 and 43 would have been gone forever.

Elsewhere in the newsletter we are launching the "Care for Kensington" initiative, which will provide a grant for a member or members of our community who submit a plan for an activity that will improve our collective quality of life. Please consider making a submission for the judging panel. There's a significant cash amount to be awarded.

Finally, I encourage you to read the community notice board which is a feature of the Garden Tools Storage shed in Borthwick Park. The shed was made possible by a grant from the Council and will make the watering roster, working bees and planting days a lot easier for all of us.


#### KRA PUB NIGHT AT THE RISING SUN INN TUESDAY 22 JUNE AT 7.30PM

## COUNCIL BUDGET AND BUSINESS PLAN OUT FOR CONSULTATION

The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters' annual business plan sets out proposed projects, services and programs for the 2021–22 financial year. The draft includes a number of largescale infrastructure projects including \$100,000 earmarked for Borthwick Park, upgrades to Burchell Reserve, the Payneham Swimming Centre, St Peters Street and the Parade Masterplan. ## HERITAGE PROTECTION CAMPAIGN & PLANNING MATTERS

In our February newsletter we reported that the new planning and development system would become operational in March and also on moves to prevent demolition of the State Heritage listed Waite Gatehouse at the intersection of Cross & Fullarton Roads.

We are pleased to report that the widespread public outrage at the proposed demolition led to a backdown by the State Government. The house will be dismantled and rebuilt at another location on the Urrbrae property. Heritage activists would have preferred it to be left where it is but at least the building will be preserved.

The Planning & Design Code for urban areas was implemented in March. Our Association lodged a comprehensive submission expressing our concerns about a number of features of the draft Code. As stated in the Protect Our Heritage Alliance's media release:

"The whole 'consultation' process has been an abrogation of community trust and the democratic process. It has ignored the dictates of the statutory Community Engagement Charter, and has been a disgraceful and deceitful failed exercise in the promulgation of public policy."

The former Chair of the State Planning Commission was quoted in the Planning Department's newsletter as follows:

"Earlier this month I gave an important briefing to South Australia's Cabinet members on the draft Planning and Design Code. The main point I wanted our parliamentary representatives to take away was that this first generation of the Planning and Design Code is largely about transitioning and consolidating existing contemporary policy from individual council development plans into the Code."

Quite clearly Cabinet was being misled as the Code does not transition and consolidate the existing Council Development Plans.

We are particularly concerned that Kensington's seventy (70) or so Local Heritage Items and its 200 Contributory Items will have a lesser degree of protection from demolition and inappropriate development than under the former NP&SP Development Plan. Under the weight of objections from both Local Government and the community regarding the department's and former Minister's refusal to include Contributory Items in the Code, the department backed down to some extent but insisted on changing the designation to Representative Buildings and has refused to identify them by a written list and they only appear on a map overlay.

We are seeking a briefing from Council's planning staff on their understanding of the implications of the Planning & Design Code for Kensington's heritage.

The Association continues its long term involvement with the Community Alliance, National Trust and Protect Our Heritage Alliance to lobby for better protection of our built heritage.

## HON MARK PARNELL RETIRES FROM PARLIAMENT

Mark Parnell recently retired after fifteen years dedicated service to the people of South Australia as a Member of the Legislative Council.

We acknowledge Mark's support for residents' groups, the Community Alliance and the National Trust in our combined opposition to changes to planning laws and controls that will negatively impact upon our built heritage and further reduce the opportunity for residents to be notified and comment on nearby development applications.

We respect Mark for his honesty and commitment to our heritage and environment and his willingness to stand up for the community as virtually a lone voice in Parliament apart from his colleague Hon Tammy Franks.

We note from the responses to Mark's valedictory speech that he was highly respected and well liked by his fellow MLCs, quite an achievement given their varied political ideologies.

## NORWOOD LIBRARY EXPANDS ITS HOME DELIVERY SERVICES

#### DISCOVER HISTORIC KENSINGTON -BENSON FOUNTAIN Cnr High St & Portrush Rd

Dr John Benson served the Kensington and Norwood community for ten years and in that time gained the loyalty and admiration of a large number of people. Tragically he died of pneumonia on the 8th July, 1877 aged 39 years.

On the day of his funeral shops were closed and flags were flown at half mast. The mile-long funeral procession of many carriages and hundreds of mourners from all sections of the community followed the hearse from his home at 50 High Street, Kensington to St Bartholomew's Church, Norwood and then to West Terrace Cemetery.

The fountain was erected by public subscription in 1879 on land given by the Sisters of St Joseph who respected the much loved Dr Benson. The memorial fountain was unveiled by Lady Elizabeth Smith, wife of Sir Edwin T Smith then Mayor of Adelaide (formerly Mayor of Kensington & Norwood). Note the early Australian coat-of-arms long before the advent of Federation. Text courtesy: Kensington Heritage Walk Brochure, City of NP&SP.

The Association successfully initiated and lobbied for the repair, restoration and landscaping of the fountain and surrounds, as part of the Portrush Road widening in 2004. Local architect Michael Pilkington prepared the landscaping plans.
