HEANES BOOT SHOP



53 Bridge Street

One of Kensington's State Heritage Items, this early shop and dwelling was built in 1847 for Samuel Heanes, a boot maker from Okehampton in Devonshire. Stones from the creek were used in the construction of the cobble and pug workshop which was at the rear of the building. By 1853, Heanes had built a cottage of four rooms and enlarged the shop. The shop front was rebuilt in 1878. Samuel Heanes served as a councillor representing Kensington for 12 years and was a member of the Volunteer Rifle Movement. The boot shop traded for over 133 years until his grandson Alfred Heanes retired in 1981.

HERITAGE AT RISK

Q: What is a State Heritage Item?

A: A place listed on the State Heritage Register. Kensington has nine State Heritage items (blue on the map), for example: Rising Sun Inn, Heanes boot shop, Benson Fountain. Listing offers protection against inappropriate alteration or demolition.

Q: What is a Local Heritage Item?

A: Local Heritage Items are places meeting one or more of eight criteria. The criteria of most importance for Kensington are: important historical, economic or social themes; aesthetic merit, design characteristics or construction techniques. Kensington has about 80 Local Heritage Items (pink on the map), for example: Richmond St cottages, Kensington Hotel. These items are protected from demolition unless structurally unsound. Alterations and additions are permitted if they do not diminish heritage features visible from the street. Under the Planning & Design Code the previous demolition controls have been weakened.

O: What are Representative Buildings?

A: Representative Buildings display characteristics of importance. Kensington has about 210 Representative Buildings (green). Formerly known as Contributory Items, examples are 31, 33, 35, 37, 41, and 43 High Street. Their preservation is critical to the integrity of Kensington's heritage status. Unfortunately, demolition controls have been weakened under the Planning & Design Code.

What's happening now?

The new Planning and Design Code, the State Government's new planning system, removes many public rights. It clears the way for a development 'free for all' at the expense of our environment, heritage and community rights. Under these changes the Minister for the Environment can simply delist items when development and demolition is proposed. We are already seeing a number of State Heritage Items currently under threat from various development proposals across the State such as the Urrbrae Gatehouse.

Why should we care?

Our historic suburb has many heritage buildings and places. We risk losing the historic character we love with the way clear for developers to demolish heritage listed buildings, destroying our urban amenity and replacing local character with poor quality infill development. We then lose trees and gardens as land becomes paved with increased stormwater run-off.

Some other impacts of the Planning and Design Code include:


- An increase in non-residential land use in residential areas;
- Fewer trees on private land;
- · Smaller blocks and more subdivisions;
- Increased parking problems, and
- Less public access to information about development activities and fewer opportunities to object or comment.

What can we do?

Our Association, together with the Community Alliance, Protect Our Heritage Alliance and the National Trust continue to campaign for better heritage protection.

BREAD TAGS REMINDER



Don't forget to keep saving your bread tags for Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs. This action diverts the tags from the waste stream into production of bowls and other products which are sold to fund the purchase of wheelchairs for the disabled or elderly. Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs are still primarily funding wheelchairs in South Africa but by mid-2021 they had gathered sufficient funds through recycling and donations to be able to help out in other countries through collaboration with Wheelchairs for Kids in WA.
