Working bees

Green thumbs getting itchy?

Join us at one of our monthly working bees in Borthwick Park on the second Sunday morning of each month. **On Jun 12th** we'll be doing more mulching. Vital to keep those winter weeds under control and enrich the soil.



Creek works

Work continues in the creek bed of Second Creek as stonemasons repair the stone walls. Removal of most of the large rocks at the edge of the creek bed involved heavy lifting equipment and a crane. Works are likely to continue until July dependent on weather. Once works are complete, access to the creek will be safer and summer standing water reduced. We will be looking to plant native species to restore the banks and landscape the affected areas.

Meet John Legg Borthwick Park Biodiversity Project Coordinator

How long have you lived in Kensington? I've lived in Kensington since 2005.

What motivated your involvement in the Borthwick Biodiversity project? I was disturbed to see virtually no understorey below the ancient redgums but rather a sea of kikuyu grass extending down the eroded banks of Second Creek.

I was inspired by an early account of the original vegetation, describing the creek full of fish and yabbies and with kangaroo grass so high it was barely possible to see where you were going Supported by the KRA and with fabulous community support, I drew up a proposal to council to revegetate the park with local native plant species.

What are the challenges?

Steering the project, from its inception in 2009 to the present has involved many stakeholders including the Council and (now) Green Adelaide. Not being the most tactful of people, this has been challenging for me!



What has been most satisfying? It's most satisfying to witness the enjoyment of visitors to the park, which now has a diverse and maturing collection of native plants, attracting birds, bats and insects enhancing the health of the redgums above.

What aspects of the park's history engage you?

It is humbling to realise that some of the old gums in the park are up to 450 years old, young saplings when the Taj Mahal was being built in 1632. What stories they could tell, of the animals and birds they supported, of the indigenous ceremonies they would have witnessed, of the coming of Europeans.
