Register via **Trybooking** to give us an idea how many plants and people we'll be hosting. This is a free event with a few basic "ground rules":

- 1. Plants and soil need to be pest-free and healthy.
- 2. Bring 1-10 items to trade e.g. struck cuttings potted in individual containers, or collected dry seeds in envelopes, or fresh cuttings in a bucket of water (without water is fine for succulents).
- 3. Ideally swap items should be labelled with the name of the giver and simple tips for success e.g. "succulent from Liz, water sparingly". We'll have blank labels and pens at the swap if you need. Or skip the labelling and share your growing tips whilst chatting.

News from Borthwick Park



Creek Works

The creek works and development of the nature playscape are complete. A happy Saturday afternoon planting session in late July saw dozens of grasses, sedges, vines and shrubs planted by a cheerful crew of locals and a lovely visitor from Japan via Wellington Street. The O'Connell kids swept off the paths and rocks and all agreed it looked pretty fab.

The winter rain has settled the plants in nicely but the sodden lawns have been damaged by all the heavy vehicle movement. Council contractors will spread loam and seed in coming weeks. A different contractor is working on the difficult-to-access southern side of Second Creek clearing weeds, planting indigenous species and spreading kangaroo grass seed collected from mature tussocks in the park.

All hands to the hoses!

Summer will soon be here and we need volunteers willing to hand-water a section of Borthwick Park between December 2022 and March 2023. Training and equipment provided. All hoses are on mobile reels for easy movement through the park. You will be rostered onto a particular week and can complete your watering tasks on any day of that week - typically watering one section takes 1-3 hours. It's a very relaxing activity - neighbours come through and chat, dogs caper about, birds zip past, the water splashes from the hose... come and soak up the goodness in the green heart of Kensington whilst you soak the plants.

Borthwick Park -Kaurna Yerta

Since British colonisation over 185 years ago, most of the Indigenous place names in Australia have been replaced with European names. 'Borthwick Park' was the colonial name given to land that has been known as Kaurna Yerta for over 65,000 years. 'Yerta' meaning 'Country.'

Kaurna people are the traditional First Nations custodians of the Adelaide Plains extending north towards Crystal Brook, south along the coast to Cape Jervis and bounded by the Mount Lofty Ranges to the east.

Second Creek (which runs from the foothills to its outlet at Karrawirra Parri/River Torrens) holds a special significance for the Kaurna people. There are many 19th Century historical accounts of 'ceremonies' and large gatherings taking place at the original bend in Second Creek, which is now part of Borthwick Park.

Over millennia Kaurna people developed unique sophisticated ways of being, knowing and learning to live sustainably in relationship with this landscape, sharing wisdom, knowledge and information across thousands of generations through dreaming stories and songlines.

In the coming months, the KRA with support of Foundation SA look forward to bringing the community together with Kaurna Elders to acknowledge, learn and celebrate the Kaurna cultural wisdom and heritage of our local Borthwick Park.

New Defibrillator

The new defibrillator purchased by KRA with Federal funding has been installed on the tool shed in Borthwick Park for use by park visitors, residents and the general public in case of a sudden cardiac arrest (heart attack). We hope no one ever needs it but if this device saves just one life we'll be over the moon.

- In an emergency phone 000, ask for an ambulance, and they will tell you the code to open the security cabinet. Unfortunately, the security is necessary as defibrillators get stolen, even though the units won't work away from their base station. Stolen defibrillators inevitably end up dumped.
- Defibrillation within the first few minutes of a cardiac arrest increases the chance of survival to over 70%.

Thanks to Peter Duffy and Andrew Pascoe for all their efforts in installation of the defibrillator, thanks Karloskar for handling the software updates, and a big shout out to our local MP the Hon James Stevens for awarding us funding for this life-saving device.

At the final Council meeting before 'caretaker' period a motion was passed calling for a report on how a Code Amendment could preserve the character of The Parade. If the State Government approves such an amendment, we might see more reasonable building heights and larger set-backs for this historic high street.

Our High Street in Kensington will see a facelift this financial year, with an upgrade to the roundabouts, plus a new one installed at the Bridge Street intersection.

The Borthwick Park creek works project has been completed, which included major engineering improvements to the creek channel and addition of nature play features on the bank. Kensington locals led by KRA recently planted the landscaping and it should be looking great in a few months.

Heritage Kensington

Kensington Hotel - 23 Regent St

Henry Scott opened the Kensington Arms Inn in 1840. It was described as being near a track formed by teamsters bringing stringy bark to Adelaide from the forests on The Tiers. Scott offered wines, spirits and malt liquors of the very best quality as well as operating a general provision store adjacent to the inn. In 1849, it was rebuilt and named the Globe Hotel. The present bluestone hotel with brick quoins and splayed corners was designed by architects Thomas English and George Soward and dates from 1882.
