Stories of Second Creek



Did you know? Second Creek (Hallett's Rivulet) rises just north of Summertown above Greenhill Road. From there it descends swiftly into Slapes Gully, through the Boral Quarry to emerge at Michael Perry Reserve in Stonyfell and then through Burnside to Kensington.

The creek, which passes through Borthwick Park on its way to the Torrens, has a rich First Nations and European settler history. More in future editions of the KRA newsletter!

Have you done the Second Creek Walk? It is possible to walk from the bridge at Glynburn Road to the Michael Perry Reserve, passing sections of the creek unaltered since colonisation.

Beautiful bush food 🥂

Billardiera cymosa or Sweet Appleberry occurs naturally along our coastal areas. The sprawling scrambler will grow to a low groundcover shrub in an open spot or climb nearby vegetation, 1 to 2 m. It has pretty flowers and small, sweet edible fruits, which can be eaten raw or cooked. Some say they have a sweet aniseed taste; others think that they taste more like kiwi fruit. Kaurna people ate the fresh fruit and traded the dried fruit.

There are a few different colour forms, from white to pink to the blue flowers we have in Borthwick Park. These can be cultivated from cuttings taken mid-Winter. Propagation is also possible from seed.

Sweet Appleberry can flower profusely once it is advanced. It should be planted in full sun or dappled shade with medium to light well drained soils. Try it in your garden.
