### Borthwick Park Biodiversity Project

Working bee 9 - 11am,  
second Sunday every month  
Borthwick Park, Thornton Street

🌱 In 2009 the KRA initiated a community-led project aiming to re-create a biodiverse ecology to support remnant River Red Gums in Borthwick Park. With support from NPSP Council and Green Adelaide, plantings began in 2010 along the creek line and have been ongoing every winter since then. Haloes of shrubs have been established around the eucalypts to increase habitat and food sources for native birds and animals and improve soil health.



Community volunteers meet 9-11am on the second Sunday of every month and work together mulching, weeding and pruning to maintain the Project plantings. Come along and see what we get up to and meet a few new locals. All tools and training are provided. Wear closed-in footwear and clothing to suit the weather. Morning tea from 11am: free tea, coffee, and a delicious spread of morning tea treats provided by the KRA Committee.

People gathered once again in this ancient place for a Kurna Cultural Ceremony, 9th July 2023



## Marni ngadlu tampinhi, ngadlu Kurna Yartanga imparinhi. It's good to be here, on Kurna Country.

On 26th January, the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters awarded the Kensington Residents Association the 2024 Community Event of the Year Award for the Kurna Cultural Ceremony held in Borthwick Park last winter.

Acknowledging that Kurna People have lived as part of this place for many thousands of years, on 9th July 2023, during NAIDOC Week, over 100 people from the local community and beyond gathered in Borthwick Park alongside Second Creek to participate in a Kurna Cultural Ceremony provided by Kurna leaders Jack Buckskin and Steven Warrior from Kuma Kaaru.

Jack and Steven ceremonially cleansed the place, provided a heartfelt Welcome to Country in Kurna language and English, and invited the community to participate in a cleansing smoking ceremony. Jack also played the yidaki (didgeridoo). The community presented Jack and Steven with an enormous bouquet of foliage from their many gardens, then shared bush tea and food featuring native bush tucker ingredients.

Many of those who participated have reflected how the Kurna Cultural Ceremony has helped them feel a deeper connection to place, and reinforced that they are part of a compassionate

community in an ancient, special and for some a sacred, spiritual place.

Some of our community felt concerned about receiving the award on Australia Day. For many Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people January 26th is a Day of Mourning, reflecting the ongoing impacts of colonialism and attempted genocide on First Nation's people across Australia.

However, we value the recognition by Council of the significance of the Kurna Ceremony held in Kensington and hope that, in some small way, it encourages other neighbourhood communities to honour and acknowledge Kurna Culture in their local places.

## Pioneer Park Project

In mid-January KRA Committee members met with local landscape architect Amanda Balmer ([waxdesign.com.au](http://waxdesign.com.au)) and cultural heritage and historical consultant Denise Schumann to discuss the idea of re-landscaping Pioneer Park in Maesbury Street. Initial informal community feedback suggests that reflecting the site's indigenous history and past use as a European cemetery is as important as designing a recreational space that meets the modern community's need for peaceful activity and connection with nature. Formal consultation with Kensington residents, Kurna elders and the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters will be undertaken in coming months.
