When: from 10am on Saturday 2nd November



In early September, after an invitation through the Council, six KRA Committee members joined a KESAB bus trip to visit various stages of Adelaide's waste management process.

Australians generally divert too many of their unwanted items to landfill (Red bins). Consequently the availability of viable sites for future landfill operations is under pressure, which in turn leads to higher costs and therefore impacts on Council rates.


In our Council area the FOGO (food organics, garden organics) system allows, indeed encourages, us to place all organic food waste in our Green bins, thus reducing the volumes being sent to landfill.


The mulch which is produced from our green waste is a valuable commodity used to reduce water demand in private and public gardens... a Win-Win! One very interesting learning was that the bottles and jars that we place in our Yellow bins would be assured of being recycled if delivered to a bottle recycling depot, along with those that attract the 10 cent deposit refund. Your KRA Committee has opened dialogue with KESAB with a view to improving our waste management practices in Kensington. We're lucky to have wild neighbours in Kensington – birds, brushtail and ringtail possums, lizards, bats, native bees and other insects. Check out the Backyard Buddies website www.backyardbuddies.org.au and learn more about local wildlife:

- · how to create habitat or homes for different species;
- · how to help wildlife in trouble;
- · how to humanely encourage possums out of your roof space or away from your favourite plants;
- · how to stop that mad magpie-lark fighting with your windows;
