# The KRA is campaigning to protect Local Heritage at 69 High Street.



## **Correction & Comparison**

We included a picture of the freshly painted Benson Fountain in the KRA's February newsletter (below left) and incorrectly credited the refurbishment to NPSP Council. The Sisters of St Joseph advised that the fountain was actually repainted as a donation from Programmed Maintenance in conjunction with work undertaken at the Convent. Kensington resident Andrew Pascoe spotted a near-identical fountain in the main street of Hay NSW and snapped the photo below (right). Mayor John Witcombe presented the fountain to the people of Hay in 1883, several years after the Kensington fountain was erected by public subscription in 'affectionate remembrance of the late John Benson, Surgeon'.

## **Regent Gardens Upgrade**

McKellar Stewart Kindergarten (MSK) is proud to be working in partnership with the KRA and NPSP Council to implement exciting upgrades to Regent Gardens, outside the Kindy grounds.

The enhancements will include colourful line-marked games on the paving, new plantings in the garden beds, and nature play spaces in the corner gardens—creating a more engaging space for kindy children, their families, and the wider community to enjoy.

Involving our young learners in the planning process is a key part of this project. The children took part in group discussions to help select the line-marked games they were most excited to play. Their enthusiasm and ideas have been a driving force in shaping this revitalisation.

A long-term vision of this project has been to celebrate local stories and history through a vibrant mural on the southern fence. We're thrilled to have received a grant from NPSP Council to fund elements of this next stage. Aboriginal artist David Booth will be working with the children on the mural, beginning in August.

Over the coming months, the Kindy community will be working closely with the Council, the KRA, and the broader local community to bring these ideas to life.

The children are already looking forward to using the newly developed area during their Kindy sessions. We are incredibly grateful for the strong relationship we share with the KRA and look forward to continuing our collaboration to create positive change within our community.











# **Borthwick Park Biodiversity Project**

New plant signs funded by a Green Adelaide grant will soon be installed in Borthwick Park. Scan the QR codes to learn more about locally indigenous plants.

Council contractors have replaced the retaining wall on the Park's Thornton St boundary using new planks and posts made of composite recycled plastic. Hooray for a long-lasting wall and for keeping plastic out of landfill! The Parks & Gardens team have also recently repaired the dolomite path leading in from Thorton St, adding a sump to help prevent wash-outs during rain events.

# Pioneer Park Grassroots Grant Application

Thanks to everyone who provided feedback on the KRA's proposal to relandscape Pioneer Park in Maesbury St. The number of emails and online survey responses received, and the level of in-person attendance at the community meeting held on 2nd May clearly impressed upon the KRA committee the strength of community feeling for this public park.

The role of our association is to listen and respond to the concerns of residents, and that is what's happening. The lawn area will be retained and the KRA will explore options for installation of additional park benches with Council's Infrastructure and Projects staff

Our application to Green Adelaide sought funding to:

- · install a 1:20 ramp into the Park to allow access for all
- · purchase 500 native seedlings to replenish the existing garden beds, along with an irrigation system upgrade to support the plants
- · enable consultation with the community and Kaurna representatives regarding future needs for the park.

We expect to hear by September if the grant application is successful.

## **The Congregational Chapel**

This depiction of the 'Congregational Chapel and School, Kensington, near Adelaide, South Australia', drawn by renowned artist S.T. Gill in 1849 and lithographed by Penman and Co., focuses on the intersection of High and Maesbury Streets. St Matthew's Anglican Church, Marryatville, is visible in the background.

The building at far left is the first Congregational Chapel opened in Kensington in December 1844. By 1848 it was insufficient for needs and a new Congregational Chapel was built adjacent. The old building was repurposed as a Sunday School. Copies of this S.T. Gill lithograph were available for purchase at a Spring fete held in 1849 to raise funds for the new chapel.

Pioneer Park in Maesbury Street was originally the Congregational Chapel's graveyard. The first interment was on 28th February 1849. The cemetery was formally closed by government proclamation on 28th October 1964. The creation of the park, in memory of the Kensington and Norwood pioneers, was undertaken by the Norwood APEX Club in 1966.

The Congregational Chapel was one of the earliest churches built in Adelaide. It was non-denominational and served the spiritual needs of the early colonists, playing a significant role in the early social history of this area. Today, the understated beauty of Kensington's Pioneer Park continues to provide a quiet space for locals to meet, rest, reflect and spend time with neighbours. It is treasured.
